

Renewable Electricity Support Agreement (RESA): Milestone extension– COVID 19



Due to the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, certain qualifying generators participating in the AESO's Renewable Electricity Program (REP) have been offered an extension to the RESA milestone dates. Those projects in the early development and construction phase that had not completed the Key Development Milestones when the World Health Organization declared a pandemic on March 11, 2020, qualified for the extension.

For these qualifying generators, the AESO has offered to extend the Commencement of Construction Longstop Date, Target COD date and COD Longstop Date by 12 months. This extension is intended to address the expected project delays caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, many of which may be beyond the control of generators in the circumstances. For more information, a copy of the RESA for each REP Round is posted on the AESO's website.

All the qualifying generators have accepted this extension and, as a result, will have additional time to complete development and construction activities.
